



## Activity: Scrapping Song & Music Video

### Background:

During WWII, there were plenty of popular songs written about the war, like Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy, You're in the Army Now, and G.I. Jive. Here's your students' chance to set their new-found commitment to recycling and energy conservation to music.

### Point Value:

### Procedure:

1. Have students in teams or as a class write lyrics for a song about the Get in the Scrap! program.
2. If you have musically talented students, you can even compose music or pick a popular tune where you rewrite the lyrics to meet the scrapping theme.
3. Finish it all off by recording a fun music video. You can give each student a role in the production process: on camera musicians, director, videographer, set design, costume, etc. Be creative!
